Additional Information: The Police Department currently has 77 active case reports and at the end of July we have received the same number of reports as we did for last year, a total of 183, unfortunately our felony reports are up 8%.

The department has received a response from the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) that they were only able to fund 14% of the COPS grant requested and unfortunately Leesburg was not selected. The application has not been denied and will remain in a “pending” status and under consideration for possible future funding.

The funding selections for this announcement were based upon a variety of factors, including (but not limited to) statutory mandates as well as each applicant’s fiscal health, UCR-reported crime and community policing plans.

The department has cleared 17 out of 39 felony reports that we have received so far this year which is approximately 47%, which is excellent considering that the department does not have a fulltime investigator to work these types of cases.
